

What are the roles of the Academic Assistants?

- ◆ One-on-one explanations of content material and assignments for both “walk-in” students and for classroom teacher referrals
- ◆ Relationship building with individual students to set goals and provide accountability
- ◆ Test review and preparation
- ◆ Monitor students’ academic progress on Infinite Campus
- ◆ Administer make-up tests
- ◆ Administer tests out of the classroom for IEP/504 accommodations or student absences
- ◆ Assist students with test corrections
- ◆ Ohio Computer-Based Assessments (OCBA) End of Course Exams: Test preparation and practice, including test-taking skills; Analysis of test results to inform intervention strategies
- ◆ Provide individualized intervention to help students reach learning goals and improve their academic performance
- ◆ Monitor attendance - tardy and absence reporting to the Student Services office

All Academic Assistants work with students on their organizational skills, study techniques, and assignment punctuality.

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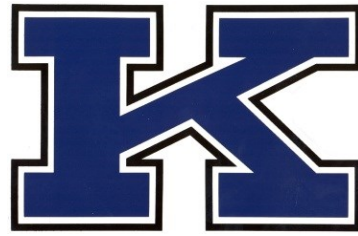
