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Overview Information

Families who elect for their students to stay home to do their learning during the 2nd semester, because they CANNOT or WILL NOT send their students to school during the current health pandemic, will receive full time instruction with online courses through Lincoln Learning Solutions, an online service partner, paid for by the District. ***There is NO LIVE teaching in this program -- it is completely on-line.*** Students will be afforded the opportunity to take grade-level appropriate courses provided through the Ohio Online Learning Program (OOLP).

This option is a commitment to the FULL SEMESTER, January 18, 2021 thru May 26, 2021. It is NOT an option to “drop in” or “drop out” based on the remote/hybrid status of the Worthington School District.

Cost

We will not charge families for this option, unless they do not complete any course or start in the program and then stop at any point. The cost of the semester program for grades K-6 is between \$1570.00 to \$2000.00 per semester (depending on the grade level).

DROPPING OR NOT COMPLETING THE PROGRAM may result in tuition charges being assigned to the family, roughly around \$500.00.

Course information

All elementary grade level courses were designed by Lincoln Learning Solutions to meet national and state learning standards, and are grade-level appropriate. Especially at elementary school level, participation in this on-line program will require the ongoing support of an adult.

Contrary to what is stated in the Parent Webinar and Slides (above), Sixth Grade coursework is provided by Lincoln Learning Solutions, not Edgenuity.

Understand that while the courses offered in the OOLP are aligned with Ohio Learning Standards, the pacing, sequencing, and materials used by Worthington Schools may differ.

In the OOLP, there is no daily connection (live teaching, classroom interaction, etc.) with a Worthington class. Special Education Services outlined on a student's IEP will continue to be offered to students by qualified teachers. Elementary Counselors will "Zoom" with OOLP students monthly to maintain connection to their home school.



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Kindergarten through Second Grade will have 3 courses: Math, English Language Arts and Science.

Third through Sixth Grades will have 4 courses: Math, English Language Arts, Science, and Social Studies.

Each course will contain 90 lessons which are to be completed by the end of the semester on May 26, 2021.

School Information - Infinite Campus (IC)

You will continue to receive building information from your child's school. We apologize if this creates confusion, but it's important for you to stay connected with your school



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community for events and information throughout the semester. Please follow established protocols for time-sensitive information to be communicated quickly (i.e. emergency medical information).

Student Learning Advocate

Your child will also be assigned to a Student Learning Advocate (SLA). The purpose of an SLA is to stay connected to your child throughout the semester to check on them, help him/her set goals to complete courses on-time, and provide social-emotional support, as needed. *They do not provide live instruction, and are not a tutor for a course.* They complete the grading and feedback for all of your child's work.

Your child's SLA will be emailing you the week of January 11th to introduce himself/herself. They will also be setting up student meetings to share a Student Orientation video and go over other information about the Lincoln Learning system for students who are new to the OOLP.

Special Education Considerations

For students with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 Plan, an Accommodation and Modification Plan will be created and loaded into each student's courses. Additional modifications or changes to the program cannot be made beyond what's on that plan. *IEP services will be provided to students through the district, however they may look differently.* Additional tutoring or support cannot be provided to supplement the learning from the Lincoln Learning courses. If any questions or concerns arise, please contact your child's Intervention Specialist for an IEP conversation or School Counselor for a 504 conversation.

Attendance Procedures

Stated in earlier information, the OOLP does not have formal class meeting times. Students work at their own pace to finish the coursework by May 26, 2021. Lincoln Learning encourages families to establish and maintain a "learning schedule" to help with the feeling that this is "real school." It's important for students not to go too slow, so they don't have too much work at the end of the semester. Likewise, it's important students don't go too fast and be left without work for an extended period of time. At the end of the course, evidence that you have logged in regularly AND you have completed the course assignments and assessments equals appropriate attendance. **Should a student not log in, and not turn in work regularly, that student may be considered as NOT IN ATTENDANCE, and our staff will reach out to you to promote engagement.**



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Failure to complete work and log in may be considered in violation of Ohio's school attendance laws, and the student may be referred for habitual absence or truancy.

Progress Reporting

Lincoln Learning can provide a "Guardian" account for parents/guardians to access the student progress for each child. You would request this of your OOLP Teacher/Student Learning Advocate. You have the ability to view time in the Lincoln Learning program through your child's account. Families new to the OOLP will be receiving account information from Lincoln Learning on how to access your child's information. The email that you provide at registration is the one that will be used.

Chromebook Needed

If you need a chromebook or hot spot for your child to complete the program, please contact the principal at your home school.
