Families who elect for their students to stay home during the 2nd semester will receive full time instruction with online courses through Edgenuity, an online service partner, paid for by the District. Students will be afforded the opportunity to take grade-level appropriate courses provided through the Ohio Online Learning Program (OOLP). Below are links to provide an overview of the information:

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Cost

We will not charge families for this option, unless they do not complete any course or start in the program and then stop at any point. The cost of the semester program for grades 7-12 is up to \$250 per semester course.

Course information

Not all classes that we offer in our Worthington Schools have a comparable online class in the Worthington Online Learning Academy (i.e., Family and Consumer Science courses, Art courses, AP Chemistry, IB classes, etc.). Understand that while the courses offered in the OOLP are aligned with Ohio Learning Standards, the pacing, sequencing, and materials used by Worthington Schools may differ.

In the OOLP, there is no ongoing connection (live teaching, classroom interaction, etc.) with the Worthington class. Special Education Services outlined on a student's IEP will continue to be offered to students by qualified teachers.

The online Edgenuity company, like all online companies responding to COVID, has seen a significant increase in the number of students taking online courses. Due to a Course Facilitator shortage, a limited number of courses are available for students entering into the OOLP courses after the August 23rd deadline. *Students who entered the OOLP before August 23 and registered for Part A of another course **can** take Part B of that class if they successfully pass Part A.

Students will **not** be able to participate in AP classes, IB classes, or other classes at our schools, except choir, band, or orchestra. If a student chooses to participate in a music class, he/she **MUST** attend classes in person on Hybrid or All In days; the student cannot participate in the class remote only. 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For Students In the OOLP For the 1st Semester

If a student is currently enrolled in the OOLP and...

Would like to stay in the OOLP for 2nd semester	THEN YOU NEED TO...	Enroll your child by November 20: OOLP Grades 7-12 Registration Link
Would like to enroll back to Worthington classes at a Worthington school (Hybrid, Remote, or All In),	THEN YOU NEED TO...	do NOTHING. After November 20, we will notify your child's school counselor that students NOT on the OOLP list will be returning.

After-School / Extra-Curricular Activities

Students will be able to participate in district athletics, extra-curricular activities, and after-school functions. *Keep in mind that for high school sport eligibility, students need to pass 5 classes from the preceding quarter.*

School Information - Infinite Campus (IC) / Schoology Courses

You will continue to receive building information from your child's school. We apologize if this creates confusion, but it's important for you to stay connected with your school community for events and information throughout the semester. Please follow established protocols for time-sensitive information to be communicated quickly (i.e. emergency medical information).



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Student Learning Advocate

Your child will also be assigned to a Student Learning Advocate (SLA). The purpose of an SLA is to stay connected to your child throughout the semester to check on them, help him/her set goals to complete courses on-time, and provide social-emotional support, as needed. *They are not a tutor for a course.*

Your child's SLA will be emailing you the week of January 11th to introduce himself/herself. They will also be setting up student meetings to share a Student Orientation video and go over other information about the Edgenuity system for new students to the OOLP.

Special Education Considerations

For students with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or a 504 Plan, an Accommodation and Modification Plan will be created and loaded into each student's courses. Additional modifications or changes to the program cannot be made beyond what's on that plan. *IEP services will be provided to students, however they may look differently.* Additional tutoring or support cannot be provided to supplement the learning from the Edgenuity courses. If any questions or concerns arise, please contact your child's Intervention Specialist for an IEP conversation or School Counselor for a 504 conversation.

Attendance Procedures

Stated in earlier information, the OOLP does not have formal class meeting times. Students work at their own pace to finish the coursework by May 26, 2021. Edgenuity provides a "progress" bar that shows to the student how many of the lessons are completed and left.

It's important for students not to go too slow, so they don't have too much work at the end of the semester. Likewise, it's important students don't go too fast and be left without work for an extended period of time. Student Athletes, keep in mind that State guidelines state students must be passing in five semester courses the prior grading period for eligibility.

Per NCAA guidelines for student athletes competing at the collegiate level, students cannot complete a course in less than 12 weeks. Courses must not be altered by a teacher.



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Progress Reporting

Edgenuity provides a “Guardian” account for parents/guardians to access the student progress for each child. You have the ability to view time in the Edgenuity program through your child’s account. Families new to the OOLP will be receiving account information from Edgenuity on how to access your child’s information. The email that is listed in Infinite Campus (not the one used to register your child for the OOLP) is the one that will be used. To help students and families with pacing the courses, the table below can be used as a guide to ensure students complete the courses by May 26:
