This new skill is causing them to master the use of subject pronouns as well as conjugating the verb "tener". There will be a formative and a summative assessment on this skill sometime soon. Students will know because it will be announced in class and parents can easily check the blue sheet or planner to see what dates were decided upon.

Sra. Newcomb's Spanish 1b students get to make an ofrenda in class on Monday, November 4th and will be encouraged to bring in memory items to represent people from their lives who they want to remember. Dia de los Muertos is a very happy celebration and is more like a family reunion than any other family event. Students will be having a summative assessment over the verb IR (to go) and places around town early in the week. Next up- inviting someone to go somewhere with you!

French

Mr. Hack

In M. Hack's 1A classes we are wrapping up our first chapter. We have learned how to introduce ourselves, asking questions to meet others, describe things in our classroom, and how to conjugate a verb. We are currently working through some final vocabulary review, and then we will move on to chapter 2.

In M. Hack's 1B classes we are wrapping up chapter 5. We have learned how to ask and tell about various sports and activities we may or may not play, days of the week, months in the year, and even a few more irregular verbs. We are currently polishing off our chapter 5 vocabulary, and then we will move on to the next chapter!

Science

Now that the 8th grade science students know how to determine changes in the surface of the Earth, we will explore the forces that cause our Earth to constantly be changing. Early scientists believed the Earth changed due to continental drift. Our students will explore that theory and the theory of plate tectonics. In comparing the two we will identify why scientists now accept the theory of plate tectonics.

Student Absence Reporting:

If your student will be absent from school, please call 614-450-4300 to report the student name, grade and reason for the absence. This allows us to document the absence in our attendance system.
