# Masking Guidelines

June 2nd: Individuals in Worthington Schools are encouraged to continue to wear a mask in school or at school-related events, but it will not be mandated. We ask families to consult with their health providers for recommendations on the best choices for their specific needs.

The District will return to pre-pandemic mitigation strategies. Should health conditions shift or stakeholder feedback necessitate, the district will assemble a Safety Team to review conditions and mitigation strategies and offer necessary revisions.

- Physical distancing: The District will return to pre-pandemic protocols. Physical distancing will be recommended, but not required.
- Handwashing: Handwashing will be emphasized throughout the school day. Hand sanitizers will be placed throughout the buildings and students will be encouraged to sanitize their hand when entering and again when leaving a classroom. Cough and sneeze etiquette will be taught, monitored, and reinforced.
- Facilities: District cleaning protocols will return to pre-COVID routines. Ventilation systems all have a MERV rating of 6-10.
- Contact tracing: Contact tracing will occur based upon CPH guidance for all highly infectious diseases. District nurses have all been trained in this process. Diagnostic and screening testing Worthington City Schools will continue to have testing and screening supplies at nursing clinics. The districts will strategically utilize test kits for COVID concerns in order to keep students safely in school as much as possible.
- Vaccinations: The district will continue to encourage faculty, staff, and students to be vaccinated. The district is willing to serve as a host site as vaccinations are available.
- Accommodations for children with disabilities: The district will build a health plan to meet the unique health needs of students. This could include home instruction or further mitigation efforts in the school setting.
- Masks: Mask wearing is encouraged but not required.
