Gap Closing

The Annual Measureable Growth (AMO) is calculated using multiple data points. For each student subgroup, the district results are compared to the statewide AMO results. "Points" are earned based on how well the district compared to the AMO, to their results last year (growth) and how far they were from meeting the AMO ("gap").

AMO - Preliminary Score

The preliminary score is the average of the English Language Arts, Math, and Graduation Rate from the preceding pages. The result is applied to the grading scale to determine a prelininary letter grade.


