Thank you for registering to participate in the Worthington Science Day on February 27th, 2016 at Thomas Worthington High School ([map](#)). We are looking forward to having you participate in the event. Please read through this entire email to help you understand how the day will run and what is expected.

Design Challenge teams less than 3 people may be combined for the competition.

Schedule of Events:

- Science Fair - 8:00 am
- Invention Convention - 8:00 am
- Design Challenge - 9:30 am

The length of the day is difficult to determine since it depends upon the number of projects to be judged. It is our goal to have all judging completed by noon. We will not be holding a live awards ceremony; however there will be a virtual awards video available early next week.

Once Science Fair or Invention Convention students receive their feedback from judges, they are free to go. Please take your project with you.

The Design Challenge should last 60 to 90 minutes. It will begin at 10:00 am.

What do I do when I arrive?

For Science Fair and Invention Convention (8:00 am)

1. Please go directly to your assigned space.
2. Pick up the judges' cards which can be found at your assigned space. The judges' cards will be paper clipped together and have your project information typed on them.
3. Take the judges' cards to the judges' station, located near the doors, to the right of the concession stand. If you do not turn in your cards, you will not be judged.
4. Return to your assigned space to set up your project and prepare for judging.

For the Design Challenge (9:30 am)

1. Check in at the Design Challenge table located in the gym and inside of the caution tape area.
2. Find your teammates and wait patiently for instructions.

When can I leave?

Students will receive the results from judging on the day of the Science Day. Once your project has been judged, please wait until a volunteer has brought you your certificate(s), ribbon(s) and completed judges' cards.

Design Challenge will be complete after each project has been scored. Students will not receive the tally cards back, but will receive a certificate and a ribbon.

Who will move on to the next level?

Science Fair - Students in grades 5-12 which receive a "Superior" rating will qualify for the Regional Science Day on MARCH 19th ([link](#)) and will receive information about registration.

Invention Convention: The top 3 projects in grades K-8 will represent the Worthington Schools at the regional Invention Convention ([link](#)) on May 7th. We will also name 4 projects to a wait list. In past years, spots have opened up to allow Worthington to send as many as 7 projects to the regional competition so please make sure to hold on to your project and journal if you are one of the top 7 projects. Results will be posted on the [Science Day](#) website early next week.

Awards?

Additional awards will be distributed sent to your teacher. We will be taking photos of every project for use on our website and in an awards video. If you have any questions or request that your photo not be used, please let us know by replying to this email. All results should be posted by March 4th.
