

Deadlines for applying



Growing trend is to apply "early". Applying early can mean one of two options:

- 1) <u>Early Decision</u>- Binding agreement. If you are accepted by the school, you will be attending that school regardless of financial award package.
- 2) <u>Early Action</u>- Non binding. You are still eligible for priority merit based scholarships, though you are not "locked" into attending the college. 73% of students who applied to OSU applied early!

Many early application deadlines are as early as 10/15 or 11/1 (i.e., ONU, OSU & Miami). Plan ahead to ensure you meet the deadline to be eligible for scholarship opportunities! Check the college's website, Common App, or speak to your son or daughter's counselor about specific college due dates (ED, EA, Regular, Rolling).

To review your application, a college needs:

- 1. Your application! This is your responsibility.
 - a. Common App, or direct to the institution.
- 2. Your transcript. Your School Counselor will complete for you.
 - a. Transcript, Schedule, TWHS School Profile, Common App Evaluation Form. Once you turn in your green transcript release form, your Counselor will send this for you.
- 3. ACT or SAT scores! You will send your scores!
 - a. Some schools accept off your TWHS transcript, some require you to send your ACT/SAT score directly from ACT or College Board.
 - b. Send your scores three weeks prior to the application due date.
- 4. *Letter of Recommendation. You, and your recommender(s).
 - a. Some colleges may not require a letter, though you always want one!
 - b. Some may require 1, maybe 2 teacher letter of recommendations.



ACT or SAT

- 1. Generally, most schools accept either the ACT or the SAT scores. *Please check the college's website for admission requirements*.
- 2. Be mindful of deadlines and give enough time to send scores! If you send scores after you test, please request scores to be sent from ACT or the College Board at least two weeks prior to deadline.
- 3. ACT and SAT scores are NOT on the TWHS transcript. Many colleges only accept scores sent directly from ACT or College Board, which costs approx. \$17.00/school to send after you test (i.e, UC, Miami, OSU, Case, CCAD).
- 4. You can elect to have your standardized test score added to your TWHS transcript. If you wish to do that, please email your child's Counselor.



New Test-Optional Reporting

Due to the limited number of standardized test offered in the spring, many colleges have gone "test optional". The # 1 question that needs to be answered is,

"Should I submit my ACT or SAT to the college I am applying to?"

Here is what we have learned:

"Applicants who have taken the ACT or SAT and feel their scores reflect their abilities should submit them." The Ohio State University. 50.6% of applicants to OSU submitted their ACT to OSU. Average ACT was a 29.5

"If you have a strong academic record with an above average GPA, but do not feel that your test results reflect your full potential, you may consider test-optional". Indiana University.


New Test-Optional Reporting

After considering your scores, you need to compare yourself to the fall 2022 cohort at the school you are applying to. For example, students accepted to OSU for the fall term had the following average scores:

ACT-29.5

SAT- 1350

Top 25% in class- (3.850 at TW)



If your ACT/SAT scores fall to the right of average, than I would send your scores. However, if they are to the left of the bell shaped curve and below average, I would not send them. At OSU, average was between a 27-32

When considering colleges...

Consider three categories: Make sure you have a safety school!

"Reach Schools" - Schools that are highly competitive, and select a low number of applicants (less than 10-15%). Your personal scores (GPA & ACT/SAT) are within reach, though it may be a reach for you to get in. Or, schools with competitive program for direct admit (OSU Business, UC DAAP Program, Purdue Engineering).

"Comfort Schools" - Schools that you feel your ACT/SAT scores, and GPA are in the average. Schools that are competitive, though may admit a higher percentage of students. Close to, if not 50% admission rate.

<u>"Safety Schools"-</u> Schools that you feel confident that you will be accepted to. Your average scores and GPA are above average and you are confident at your chances of getting in, or know you will get in.

Reach, Comfort, Backup

For example, Rachel has a 3.70 GPA, and scored a 26 on her ACT. She has completed 1 AP class and is on basketball team. She wants to pursue a degree in Engineering.

Reach- OSU, Miami, UC

Comfort- OU, Kent State, BGSU, Akron

Backup- Toledo, Wright State, YSU, Cleveland State





Does TWHS rank students?

Like Dublin, Olentangy, UA, & Bexley, Worthington City Schools does <u>not</u> rank students. However, we will rank all students with a 4.000+ GPA as # 1. <u>70</u> students share this rank!

Here is why we don't rank: <u>You may be awarded more \$!</u> Many colleges award scholarships based on your class rank. For example, The Ohio State University:

Maximus Scholarship - \$3,000 per year (\$12,000 over 4 year) if you are top 3% of your graduating class. However, the 70th ranked student (with a 4.0) is ranked outside the top 15% of the class (out 431). This would drop them to the Trustees scholarship which is \$1,000 per year, or \$4,000 over the four years.




Applying to college is done by applying via the Common App, or direct to the institutions website. Over 1000 colleges are now members of the "Common Application". This allows the student to fill out one single application for multiple schools! Remember, when creating your Common App account, please use a

personal email, not your school email address!


First, use the College Search tab to add colleges you are applying to to the My Colleges tab.




The colleges you wish to apply to will populate under the "My Colleges" tab.









Next, begin answering all the questions under "Common App"




Then, answer questions under each college listed in the "My Colleges" tab. You'll also find deadlines, fees, and contact info.



Please be sure to sign the FERPA Waiver!



Once you have completed the Common App and College Questions, you can Review and Submit!







Helpful hints:

- 1) Be careful! Each college has questions that you have to answer before you submit.
- Some colleges (like UC) may have an additional writing supplement. You will see these questions under, "My colleges".
- 3) You must sign the FERPA agreement so your counselor can send your docs! We encourage you to "waive your right" to view the documents sent on your behalf.
- Please do not use nicknames! Enter your name exactly as it is written in Infinite Campus.
- 5) Use the same email address on all documents!

Naviance

Our tool to communicate with you and the institutions you are applying to! On Naviance, you can:

- 1) Request and track transcripts & required documents.
- 2) Complete college searches.
- 3) Request teacher letter of recommendations



Naviance

TWHS is a Naviance school. In other words, the School Counselors will submit all required documents to the colleges you are applying to via Naviance eDocs. The easiest way to access Naviance is Google, "Naviance", or find the link on the TWHS website.

Please review the steps of matching your Common App account to Naviance in tonight's handouts. This document will guide you through the process of linking your Common App Account to Naviance!



Letters of Recommendation

- Do not send more than what the college is asking for! Check
 Naviance for the number of recs required and allowed!
- Recommendations can come from TWHS staff, a coach, or community member.
 - Ask yourself, "Who knows me best?" Also, consider the program that you are interested in studying in college.
 For example, Engineering? Ask a former STEM teacher.
- When asking a teacher, use the "Teacher Request for Letter of Recommendation" form provided tonight.

Letters of Recommendation



- Invite teachers online through Naviance.
 - O Steps 9, 10, & 11 on your directions in the packet given to you at Senior Information Night.
- Invite "Other recommenders" (non-Worthington City Schools teachers) through Common App.
- Counselors will conduct a senior interview with you. Parents should complete
 the "Brag Sheet" (in packet) prior to the senior interview and return it with the
 student. A Counselor letter of rec does not fulfill a required teacher letter of
 rec.
- Plan ahead! Allow up to 10 school days for your letter of recommendation to be written. For example, if it is due on 11/1, then ask by October 19th.

Letters of Recommendation

Please be aware! Once a teacher submits a letter of recommendation through Naviance, they can <u>not</u> go back and "unsubmit"! Further, you need to prioritize which teacher letter of recommendation you want sent if the college only allows one! We recommend you chose specific colleges for each recommendation.

Your counselors will submit:

- 1) Transcript, which include ACT/SAT scores (*most colleges will not accept ACT or SAT from our transcript. Therefore, you must send your scores directly from actstudent.org, or collegeboard.com)
- 2) Common App School Report
- 3) Common App Written Evaluation (*If requested from student)
- 4) TWHS School Profile
- 5) Current Course Schedule

Please know, there is an extended window of time from when your counselor submits your documents, to when the college "pulls" the data from Naviance or Common App into their system. Your docs are timed stamped from when they were submitted.

Transcripts from Higher Ed

If you participated in College Credit Plus while a student at TWHS, you received dual credit. Please know that secondary schools will NOT accept college credit from your TWHS transcript.

In order for your CCP credit to transfer from COTC, CSCC, OSU, etc., you must order an official transcript from that institute and have it sent directly to the college that you will be attending. Do this prior to your orientation so your college advisor has record of your completed coursework.

Scholarships & Grants

There are three "levels" of scholarships:

- 1) <u>Local</u>- Due out in the spring. Monetary gift awarded one time. Applications required.
- 2) <u>Institutional-</u> Merit based, or college specific.
- 3) <u>National-</u> Generally from private businesses, organizations, etc. Create an account on fastweb.com for a list of hundreds of national scholarships. Also, check the scholarships listed on Naviance!

Grants- Gift money often based off of the 2022 tax information reported on the FAFSA. Grants are often need based from EFC. We recommend every family to complete the FAFSA.

<u>FAFSA</u>

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will NOT open October 1 as it has the last few years.

Due to significant changes in the FAFSA, the Department of Education will not open the FAFSA until a date to be determined in December.

Colleges may push back their FAFSA priority dates. Keep checking with the colleges when new deadlines are for submitting your FAFSA. For example, OSU priority deadline moved from 12/1 to 2/15.

Worthington City Schools will have a FAFSA presentation in mid November at Worthington Kilbourne High School with financial advisors willing to assist.
